CALL TO WORSHIP

- P: Have you heard the good news? A baby is to be born in Bethlehem, and his birth will bring joy to the world!
- C: Jesus will be born to make all things new!
- P: Have you heard the good news? God anointed Jesus to proclaim good news to the poor.
- C: Jesus will proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind.
- P: Jesus will set the oppressed free, and proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.
- C: Let us worship with glad and joyful hearts—Jesus will be born soon!

ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING

- P: A long time ago, a baby was born in a town called "House of Bread." His name was Jesus. After his birth, Mary, his mother, witnessed the shepherds glorifying and praising God, filled with joy at what they had seen. She treasured these things in her heart.
- AM: First, we light the candle of hope. Hope is believing things can get better with compassion and imagination.
- P: Next, we light the candle of peace. Peace is what happens when everyone treats each other, themselves, and the world kindly.
- AM: Today, we light the candle of joy. Joy is when you feel so thankful you could burst with excitement and gratitude.
- P: As we light this candle, we are reminded that, from the manger, joy is growing...growing to be God with us. His name is Jesus, Bread of Life.

⁷John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸ Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ⁹ Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." 10 And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" 11 In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." 12 Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" 13 He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." 14 Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." ¹⁵ As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶ John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." ¹⁸So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.


PRAYER FOR THE OFFERING



COMMUNION

Communion will take place via continuous line. We welcome all baptized persons to the Lord's Table who believe Christ is truly present in the bread and wine. Children are welcome to be brought forward to receive a blessing. Participants will be offered a wafer and invited to eat with these words, "the body of Christ given for you." Gluten free wafers are available. Next, step to the side, to the silver tray that

contains glasses of white grape juice at the center and outer empty glasses for wine. Lastly, participants will step to the last assistant who will pour the wine and share these words, "the blood of Christ shed for you." Place your glass in the small silver bowl at the end of the first pew as you return to your seat. If you wish to come forward and not receive either element, simply cross your arms for a blessing.




