





Communion will take place via continuous line (right side) and continuous kneeling (left side). We welcome all baptized persons to the Lord's Table who believe Christ is truly present in the bread and wine. Children are welcome to be brought forward to receive a blessing. Participants to the right will be offered a wafer and invited to eat with these words, "the body of Christ given for you." Gluten free

wafers are available. Next, step to the right, to the silver tray that contains glasses of white grape juice at the center and outer empty glasses for wine. Lastly, participants will step to the last assistant who will pour the wine and share these words, "the blood of Christ shed for you." Place your glass in the small silver bowl at the end of the first pew as you return to your seat. If you wish to come forward and not receive either element, simply cross your arms for a blessing.

Welcome Bishop Sue Briner

Emanuel's welcomes Bishop Sue Briner today as our guest preacher in the congregation's "Stewardship and Ministry" series. The Rev. Susan (Sue) J. Briner of New Braunfels was re-elected May 5, 2024, to serve a second six-year term as bishop of the Southwestern Texas Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). She is the first woman to serve as a bishop in the history of the three ELCA synods in Texas. As an immigrant herself, Bishop Briner is passionate about welcoming the stranger, and our territory has the longest border with Mexico of any synod. She currently serves on the board of Global Refuge, and is the co-chair of the Bishop's Immigration Ready Bench. Her synod is coordinating a multi-synodical grant, Sembrando en Los Margenes, focused on a coordinated effort to support and sustain vibrant ministry along the border.


